CLEAT CHOCKS CATCH THE EYE BUT NOT THE LINE

Stainless-steel cleat chocks from New Found Metals are not only stylish and innovative, but are hand-polished so lines can pass through without danger of chafing. A cleat chock can function as a cleat, a chock or a fairlead.

The chock's horns are offset from the base at a slight angle, to lead the mooring line away from the hull as much as possible. The cleat chock can be mounted inboard or outboard.

Hand-polished cleat chock surfaces, especially the undersides of the horns, ensure uniform smoothness to virtually eliminate friction against secured lines.

The 316 Series comes in three sizes: 8", 10" and 12", with 3/8" x 2" studs on the first two and a 1/2" x 2" stud on the 12-incher. The smallest chock weighs about 2-1/2 lbs.

MSRP of the cleats start at \$39.95.
